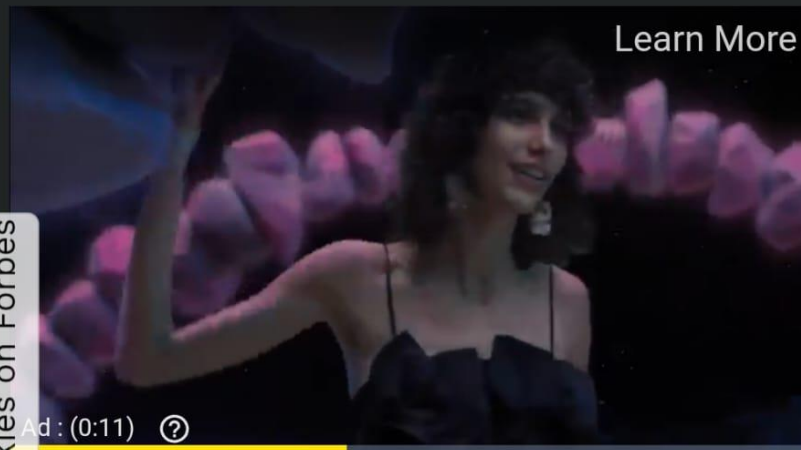
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Today's international independent women designers are a diverse group. They elevate

She continues, “I am fascinated with opals and moonstones; their changing colors feel magical, and each seems to have its own personality. When I see a gemstone that has this type of character, I think, “how can I turn this into an original modern amulet that will make me feel protected and special.” She adds.

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“My goal is to continue to create jewelry that my customers feel they can’t leave the house without wearing. And that my pieces reflect or enrich something about their life and strengthens them,” Dabbah adds.

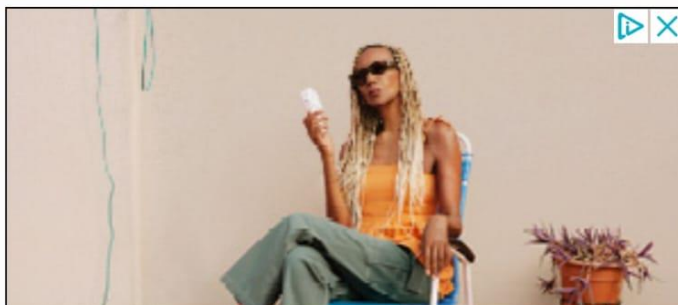
